The Wood County Land Conservation Department sells:

•**Generic Gel** - a starch absorbent that retains water and gives it back to the plant during dry periods. The gel increases plant survivability. Three sizes are available 4oz., 1lb, and 3 lbs.



Less is more, the 4oz, is good for 250 transplants and 1000 seedlings, 1lb is good for 1000 transplants and 4000 seedlings and the 3lb is good for 3000 transplants and 12,000 seedlings.

•**Tree Shelters** - 4-foot plastic, seamless, twin-walled tubes. They protect newly planted seedlings from wildlife damage. They produce a greenhouse environment, resulting in high survival rates and faster growth.

•**Tree Planter rental** - The Land Conservation Department also has four tree planters for rent. The green planter operates off of tractor hydraulics and has a pin hitch. The yellow planter also operates off tractor hydraulics and has a 1 7/8" hitch. The red planter operates with hand pump hydraulics (no tractor hydraulics needed) and has a 1 7/8" hitch. The DNR also has a three-point hitch planter available for rent. We have the hitches if you need them. Rental fee is \$20.00 per 1000 trees. If you are interested in renting these please call the LCD to schedule a time and get a contract signed.

•**Tree Spade rental** - The LCD also has three tree spades available to help you plant your seedlings. Tree spades can be rented for \$5.00/day. If you lose or fail to return it you are responsible for the replacement cost. Please call the office to get on the schedule and get a contract signed.

Wood County's Tree & Shrub Program

- This program has been offered for over 20 years. The program offers a variety of native conifers, hardwoods, shrubs, and wildflowers for interested area residents to purchase.
- Order form deadline to purchase is mid-January. Tree pickup is typically mid-late April depending on the spring weather.
- Each year the department gives landowners the opportunity to purchase these items at a minimal cost. All landowners ordering will receive a notice that will provide exact pickup details for their order prior to the scheduled distribution.

Important Tree Program Information

- Order early, as some trees may be in short supply and substitutions may be necessary.
- Payment is due at time of order.
- We cannot accept credit cards for payment – only checks or cash.
- Non Sufficient Fund checks will be returned with order form and no trees will be available. A 30\$ NSF will also be assessed
- All people ordering trees will receive a notice via mail or email that will provide pickup dates and times.
- Items not picked up on designated dates/times will not be available for pickup or refund unless arrangements are made with our office prior to the distribution date.



Important Information Continued

- Species for sale change every year land-owner request are considered annually.
- Come in bundles of 25 trees or shrubs.
- Occasionally smaller bundles will be available for fruit species if offered that year.
- If you missed the deadline to order you may get on a list for extras that are distributed in list order after the sale.
- Wildflower seed mixes are available in a variety of sizes, different purposes and diverse soil conditions.
- Wildflower seed is grown and harvested in Wisconsin to promote native plants.



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
