Sheriff Becker thanked Chief Deputy Dorshorst and Finance Director Marla Cummings for putting the resolution together. Sheriff Becker is anticipating a start date in September 2019.

The Sheriff's Department is accepting applications until Sunday, March 17, 2019 for the Deputy Sheriff eligibility list.

**i. Public Safety Investigation Lieutenant:** Sheriff Becker stated the process for the Investigative Lieutenant has started. Seven applicants took the test on March 8, 2019 with all seven applicants passing. Sheriff Becker stated the test was vetted and came from Wisconsin Personnel Partners. On March 12, 2019 there will be an outside panel coming for interviews and on March 15, 2019 there will be an inside panel doing interviews. Sheriff Becker said whoever finishes in the number one spot will be offered the job as the new Investigative Lieutenant.

#### JAIL UPDATES

- 1. Inmate Population
  - a. 115 in house/260 total inmates with safe keepers
  - b. 2019=235 yearly average (2018 yearly average 225)
    - i. Wood County has implemented the use of boat beds due to overcrowding
    - ii. The additional 25 safe keepers beds are filled
    - iii. Adams County can no longer take female inmates due to their overcrowding
    - iv. Start contacting other counties for space availability
    - v. Reviewing logistics of another location (one additional vehicle/one fulltime officer)
- 2. We need to consider a contract for additional 25 safe keepers
- 3. Jail Sergeant positions (past position Lead Correction) two have been promoted and we are in the process for the remaining two
- 4. With the recent resignation of Laura Grode (took positon at Mill) we just hired Courtney Devine, so we are again at full staff
- 5. Recently Maintenance made an upgrade to our Holding Cells to allow power access for medical devices (hole drilled in walls.) This will allow us to plug in devices without stringing extension cords down the hallways. We are still looking into option to add power to cellblocks; however it is not as easily done. Power in these locations will require some major upgrades or the replacement of our operating systems.
- 6. Camera system in jail. I have expended each system (have two systems) 27 TB (total 54.50 TB space) this give us about 50 days of video storage. Our current video system is limited and cannot be expanded any further as the operating system can only support a maximum of 4 TB per drive (eight drives per unit)
- 7. In speaking with Maintenance the Jail mechanicals (air handlers /HVAC) are due for service and replacement. Nothing has been set yet; however we are looking at approximately one million over the next five years.)
- 8. Professional Services: We recently moved some offices around the inside of the jail. EMP is up front and Mental Health has moved to the old EMP office. WE have had multiple additional requests to add services for inmates, but have not been able to add the volunteer organizations due to space. (Conference rooms/library)
