1. Call meeting to order. Meeting called to order at 8:00 am.
2. Declaration of Quorum. A quorum declared.
3. Public comments. Pete Winestorf, Chairman for Town of Rock. He stated he is communicating as a Town of Rock resident, unless directed differently by the board.
4. Correspondence.
 - Letter sent to County Board Supervisors inquiring about townships receiving additional revenue share of County Forest timber sales, and revenue from parks to assist in funding adjacent town roads. This will be on the September agenda to discuss.
 - R. Hawk said that he attended a recent meeting regarding resolution to oppose a couple of bills for heavier trucks. They are looking at scheduling a special HIRC meeting prior to next county board to sign these resolutions.
 - Bill Clendenning, Discussion at recent RC&D meeting included resolution from Burnett County regarding the State Forest Administrator's Grant. Supervisor Clendenning has shared this information with C. Schooley and F. Schubert.
 - Highway AC heater failed recently. They found a company that would make them another one and have the money in the machinery fund to purchase this. They will be ordering this tomorrow and installing it in a couple of weeks.
 - The Pittsville area ATV Route/Trail Ribbon Cutting ceremony is scheduled for September 18, 2019 to begin sometime in later afternoon, approximately 4:30pm. More details to come.
5. **CONSENT AGENDA.** Per Supervisor Winch, pull pages 11, 12, 13, 14, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20. Per Chairman Fischer, page 10. **Motion by L. Pliml and second by M. Hokamp. Motion carried.**
 - a. Approve minutes from previous committee meetings
 - b. Department Staff Reports

6. Review items, if any, pulled from consent agenda
 - Chairman Fischer began with page 10. C. Schooley presented Special Use Permit to allow outdoor equipment rental at our parks this year, from the company Northward Paddle and Paddle. He would like to do a pop-up event this fall at some of the park locations for a daylong rental at the boat landings of kayaks. C. Schooley will have Corp. Coun. review any agreement for this event. **Motion to approve providing rental equipment within the parks such as Kayaks, Canoes, Paddleboards, etc. by L. Pliml and second by B. Winch. Motion carried.**

- B. Winch believes it is wrong the Parks is fundraising for Powers Bluff when they have not given a bottom dollar for each phase yet. B. Winch asked questions regarding the other pages pulled from the Consent Agenda. B. Winch continued with questions on the other items pulled from the Consent Agenda.

Motion by L. Pliml and second by D. Polach to approve the Consent Agenda. Motion carried.

7. ATV Policy for Shared Highways (Highway). R. Hawk discussed regarding the Township of Grand Rapids. There should be a policy that we would not open any county roads or force any Wood County townships to open their roads to ATV traffic. A. Fischer states we do need some consistency from a policy standpoint. L. Pliml agrees but take a second look at this. In Grand Rapids, you are allowed to cross from one side to the other, allowed to use the most direct route, not necessarily perpendicular. This is something that will evolve and we should take a longer look at this before we create a policy.
Motion to approve L. Pliml and second by B. Winch to approve moving forward to create a policy to not allow the county to order a municipality to become an ATV route.

8. HIGHWAY

- a. Employee Recognition – 40 Year Anniversary. Steve Breu, 40 years to one employer deserves recognition. He started in 1979.
- b. Employee Policy – Reporting to Work Site. **Motion to approve the policy as presented, L. Pliml and second by M. Hokamp. Motion carried.**
- c. Sale of Low-Use Highway Properties. R. Hawk would like a few things verified before he moves forward with a resolution. Will put the parcels up for bid on state surplus auction site. It is more advantageous to go through a Phase 2 process with this 40-acre parcel. **Motion to spend up to \$10,000 for this process by L. Pliml, second by D. Polach. Motion carried.**
R. Hawk presented a parcel that is five acres within the existing quarry parcel. He stated they would not want the sale of this parcel to restrict the Department from being able to continue mining on the property if the five acres is sold. L. Pliml recommended a deed restriction that states whomever owns this property could not build a dwelling on this parcel, which may impede mining operations. P. Kastenholz would have to draft the language for the resolution to be sure all is in order before moving forward. R. Hawk states there are two ways to sell this property. Direction is have a conversation with P. Kastenholz and be sure Wood County is doing everything correctly and then bring this back to the committee for approval. Tabled for a later date.
- d. Updated Access Policy. Chairman Fischer requests that this be brought back to the committee next month for consideration.
- e. Sign Crew Staffing. Additional sign crew member position. This would be funded 80 percent by the State Maintenance funds. Salary cost for this position would be approximately \$45K. **Motion by D. Polach and second by M. Hokamp. Motion carried.**
- f. Overweight Vehicle Forfeiture Violations

9. PARKS AND FORESTRY

- a. Fleet vehicle replacement request. P&F has a 2005 F150 they would like to replace with the Highway Department's 2006 GMC Canyon, which they were going to sell on the Wisconsin Surplus Auction website. A fair price that was agreed upon is \$3K. The second vehicle P&F would like to replace is a 2011 Chevy Equinox. Although this vehicle has low miles it has had engine issues for the past couple years. The Highway Dpt. Mechanic has recommended replacing this vehicle sooner than later. C. Schooley would like to use monies from their non-lapsing equipment auction fund to purchase both of these vehicles. **Motion to replace both**

vehicles and with a process that is most advantageous to Wood County by M. Hokamp and second by B. Winch. Motion carried.

- b. Low use park property. C. Schooley handed out a map of locations within South Wood County Park that have been identified as low use areas. Chad stated that these areas may not be currently being used, but there is definitely future potential use due to the high amount of visitors that enjoy this park. Consent of committee was to table this item indefinitely.
- c. MSA Powers Bluff Update. C. Schooley handed out maps and drawings of these properties to show the updates and changes to the Master Plan. They will be providing an estimate for this project in the near future. They are targeting the September or October HIRC meeting for a presentation by MSA, along with a full estimate.
- d. Parks Revenue Report. Discussed.
- e. Forestry Revenue Report. Discussed. There was some scattered storm damage in the area. More significant damage in specific areas and will be setting up direct sales for cleanup.
Motion to approve both reports by D. Polach and second by M. Hokamp. Motion carried.
- f. Contract Extension: #767 Wiitala & Vozka Logging. Requesting that the committee grant a one year extension on this contract that expires 6/1/2020. Contractor is requesting this due to recent storms and heavy storm damage to areas in northern Wisconsin and resulting need to concentrate efforts there. Pros and cons of granting this early extension were discussed. F. Schubert's recommendation is to do a 6-month extension. **Motion to approve a 6-month extension by B. Winch and second by M. Hokamp. All yes, 1 no by A. Fischer for the reasons that it's too early to even consider an extension and would make more sense to do this in late winter or early spring. Motion carried.**
- g. Set date for Parks, Forestry & Highway Tour. Tentatively set for September 19, 2019. Meet at Highway Dept. at 8:00 am. C. Schooley, F. Schubert and R. Hawk will create an agenda for this day. Roland would like to include the asphalt plant to the tour.

Subject: Commissioner Report for September 5, 2019 HIRC meeting

Department Activities

Personnel

A mechanic resigned August 16, began advertising for a replacement. Interviews will take place in September.

Highway Projects

CTH U (STH 54 – S Biron Dr.) Construction YR 2020. Acquisition of R/W complete.

CTH U (Bridgewater/Classic Development) Commissioner working on Jurisdictional Transfer of segment old highway and discontinuance of a segment.

CTH H West County Line to Lincoln Ave, contracted with WDOT, project is complete and open to traffic.

CTH N Bridge, near intersection of CTH T, Town of Richfield. Bridge is complete and open to traffic.

CTH V from Cary-Rock Road to US 10 is open to traffic, have to complete shoulder work.

CTH S from CTH F to CTH C, Town of Sigel, project is complete and open to traffic. Some additional ditch cleaning will be performed in the next few months.

CTH D from Elm Lake Road to STH 73 scheduled to be paved and open to traffic by September 13.

Highway Maintenance

Significant storm damage on Friday July 19 and Saturday July 20. Estimated cleanup cost is between \$80K - \$90K. Due to the extent of debris to remove from the R/W and the late construction start from a cold-wet spring, highway department has one small crew working on debris cleanup until construction projects are completed.

ATV Plan

CTH Q was signed and open to ATV/UTV traffic in early August. A resident in the Town of Saratoga has requested the Commissioner to open a portion of CTH Z from Heminger Court to Hillcrest Ave. (approximately ¼ mile) (*Ongoing*)

Frac Sand Development

Agreement and invoice for improvements to CTH V was sent to Carbo Ceramics for signatures July 25.

Unused/Low-Use County Highway Property

Commissioner has contracted with REI Engineering to conduct a limited Phase II investigation on one of the parcels in the Town of Rock know to be an inactive solid waste landfill.

Two other parcels are being prepared for listing on Wisconsin Surplus Auction site.

The commissioner is working with Corporation Council on sale procedures for the portion that is being requested for purchase from a resident adjacent to the quarry site in the town of Carry.

Wisconsin County Highway Association

Commissioner testified in favor of AB 262 on Thursday August 22. *Agenda Item*

NC Region Legislative Breakfast is scheduled for October 18, 2019 in Stevens Point. HIRC is welcome.

Highway Access Control Policy

Commissioner shared draft Highway Access Control Policy with HIRC in August. This will replace and enhance the driveway policy and permit. *Agenda Item..*

On Line Permitting

Highway Department is working on the development of the On-Line permitting process. This was approved at the February 2019 HIRC. Expect to have the system in operation by January 1, 2020. Permits to be available are, utility, access/driveway, overweight/over length/over height, seasonal weight restriction, and special events such parades.

Accounting Supervisor Report

HIRC Meeting

Revenues

Revenues are as anticipated. We received the Carbo payment of \$85,000. We have been working on several Road Aid and Bridge Aid projects so the revenue will be booked as those projects get completed. Asphalt revenues continue to come in as we run the plant full-time. Revenues from the State are on target.

Expenses

Expenses are as anticipated. As required by the Uniform Cost Accounting System, I have begun using cost allocation accounts for several funds, resulting in "negative expense figures". The cost allocation accounts replace the revenue accounts for funds such as Fuel Handling and Machinery Operations.

Other

I have completed an initial draft of the budget. There are a few issues with the new budget software so the draft is not available for the packet. For the most part, I left the budget figures for supplies and materials the same as last year. The big changes will be in Personal Services, which includes wages, health insurance, FICA, etc.

If all goes well, I plan to have a draft available some time during the week of the HIRC meeting and will get it out to the members for their review before the meeting on Sept. 5th. I am happy with the new software and ecstatic that we will go from a 165 page budget document to something around 25 pages. I think the members will also enjoy the easy readability of the new reports.

Chapter 1 General Provisions

1.1 Title

This ordinance shall be known as, cited, and referred to as: THE WOOD COUNTY HIGHWAY ACCESS CONTROL ORDINANCE.

1.2 Statutory Authorization.

This ordinance is adopted under the authority of the provisions set forth in Sections 83.015(2), 83.06 and 86.07(2) of the Wisconsin State Statutes.

1.3 Purpose.

The purpose of this ordinance is to restrict and regulate access onto county highways in order to promote the public safety, convenience, general welfare, economic viability, and to protect the public investment of existing and proposed highways by preventing costly road improvements, and to provide for safe and efficient ingress and egress to Wood County Highways.

1.4 Interpretation.

The restrictions, requirements and regulations contained in this ordinance are intended to apply to objects, structures, uses and activities wholly or partially contained in the right-of-way of the Wood County highway system except where specifically indicated. Any object, structure, use or activity partially lying in the right-of-way shall be considered to be entirely within the right-of-way.

1.5 Severability.

If any section, provision, or portion of this ordinance is adjudged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

1.6 Compliance with Ordinance.

Any person, firm, or corporation seeking to construct, upgrade or reconstruct a driveway with access upon a county trunk highway within Wood County shall comply with the requirements of this ordinance and any other applicable County ordinances and regulations.

1.7 Effective Date.

The effective date of this ordinance shall be August 1 2019.

Chapter 2 Definitions

The following terms shall be applied as indicated throughout this ordinance.

2.1 **General.**

- (A) The present tense includes the future tense and the singular tense includes the plural.
- (B) The word "shall" is mandatory; the words "may" and "should" are permissive.
- (C) The words "used" or "occupied" also mean intended, designed, or arranged to be used or occupied.
- (D) The word "person" includes any individual, firm, association, joint stock association, organization, partnership, limited, trust, body politic, governmental agency, company, corporation, and includes any trustee, receiver, assignee, or other representative thereof.
- (E) All distances unless otherwise stated shall be measured in feet in the horizontal direction.

2.2 **Definitions.**

ACCESS. Driveway or other ways or means of approach to provide physical entrance or exit to a parcel.

ACCESS PERMIT. A permit from the Wood County Highway Commission granting authority to construct and/or modify and maintain an access onto a CTH.

ADT. Average Daily Traffic generated on a given road or highway.

COMMISSION. Wood County Highway Commissioner and designees.

COMMITTEE. Wood County Highway Infrastructure and Recreation Committee

COUNTY TRUNK HIGHWAY (CTH). Any segment of the Wood County Trunk Highway System pursuant to Section 83.025 of the Wisconsin State Statutes.

DRIVEWAY. Any access to a parcel for motorized or non-motorized vehicles.

LOCAL CTH. Any CTH outside the municipal boundaries of a city or village with a speed limit of 25 mph or less.

PARCEL. The area of land within the property lines of a given piece of property.

ROAD. Any public or private road, street, alley, expressway, highway, avenue, parkway, lane, drive, boulevard, circle, bypass, or other pathways intended for the use of motorized or non-motorized vehicles to obtain access to more than two parcels.

RURAL CTH. Any CTH with a speed limit of 55 m.p.h.

SEMIURBAN CTH. Any CTH with a speed limit of 45 m.p.h.

URBAN CTH. Any CTH with a speed limit below 45 mph and above 25 mph

Chapter 3 Regulations

3.1 **Existing Access.**

Any lawful use of an access to a CTH (via driveway or road) prior to the effective date of this ordinance may be continued.

3.2 Vacated Access.

If the Commission considers the use of an access to have been discontinued for a period of at least one year, the Commission shall notify the owner by certified mail that the access may be considered vacated. The Commission will allow the owner thirty (30) days to reply. If, after this time period and after consideration of the owner's reply, if any, the Commission decides that the access has been discontinued for at least one year, the access may be considered vacated and removed. The Commission will pay the entire cost of removal.

3.3 Change of Use.

An application for a change of use of an existing access is required. The review shall be the same as if it were for a new access. The Commission shall determine if there has been a change in use to an access which will affect safe and efficient ingress and egress to and use of a CTH. This determination shall be based primarily on a significant change in the volume of traffic or the type of vehicle using that access. Upon such determination, the Commission may grant an access permit for the change of use, require modifications to the access to meet standards of this ordinance or deny the request for the change of use unless otherwise provided herein.

3.4 Access to Highway.

Entrance upon or departure from a CTH shall be prohibited except at locations specifically designated by this section. Access permits as stated in sections below shall only be granted upon a field review that confirms that the access provides safe sight distance. No access or road shall be opened into or connected with any CTH without an access permit. No access shall be converted from one use of access to another use of access without an access permit.

3.5 Access Spacing and Frequency.

- (A) In a case where a property owner owns more than one adjacent parcel (of the same land use) with frontage, all parcels shall be treated as a separate parcel for the purposes of this section.
- (B) Where a property owner owns more than one adjacent parcel with frontage on the same side of the CTH, all of which are zoned or used for agriculture, no more than four (4) accesses shall be allowed in a mile.
- (C) Only one access shall be allowed per parcel zoned or used for residential.
- (D) Commercially and industrially zoned parcels may be allowed two accesses provided they each separately meet the remaining criteria of this ordinance.
- (E) Whenever possible, access should be connected to the most minor road adjacent to the property when there is a choice between roads.
- (F) 1. Subject to Paragraph 2 below, access permits for any access shall not be issued if the resulting distance between accesses or between the proposed access and any road intersection shall become less than the following distances measured from the centerline of the proposed access to the centerline of such other access or intersecting road, measured along the CTH:
 - 500' for RURAL CTH
 - 400' for SEMIURBAN CTH
 - 300' for URBAN CTH-I
- 2. The Commission may permit spacing between a field entrance and another access, including, but not limited to, another field entrance, to be closer than the distance required by Paragraph 1 above, but not closer than 250 feet, if the Commission finds that the field entrance location utilizing the reduced spacing requirements would be consistent with public safety considerations.

3. Field entrances not meeting the spacing requirements of Paragraph I above may not be converted to a private entrance without advance review by the Commission and advance written approval of the Commission.
 4. This Subsection (F) does not apply to a LOCAL CTH.
- (G) A new road, in addition to the spacing requirements to adjacent driveway access points in (F) above, must be at least:

from the nearest adjacent road which enters onto the same side of the CTH in question. Where possible, roads should not be staggered, creating "T" intersections, but connect with another road on the other side of the highway.

3.6 Paved Apron.

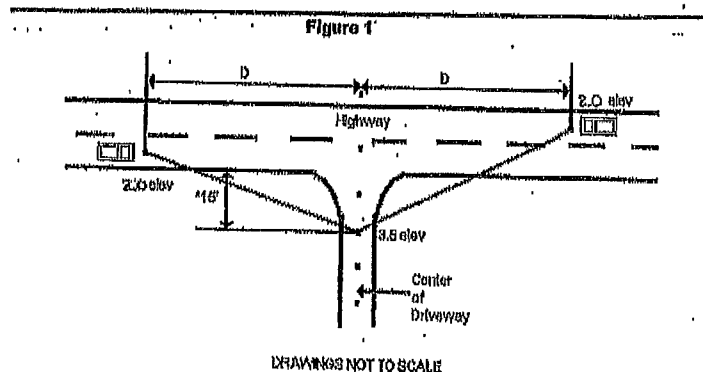
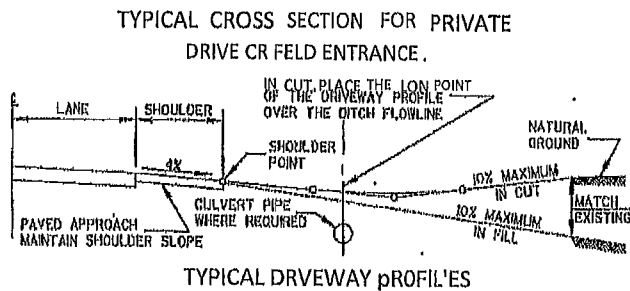
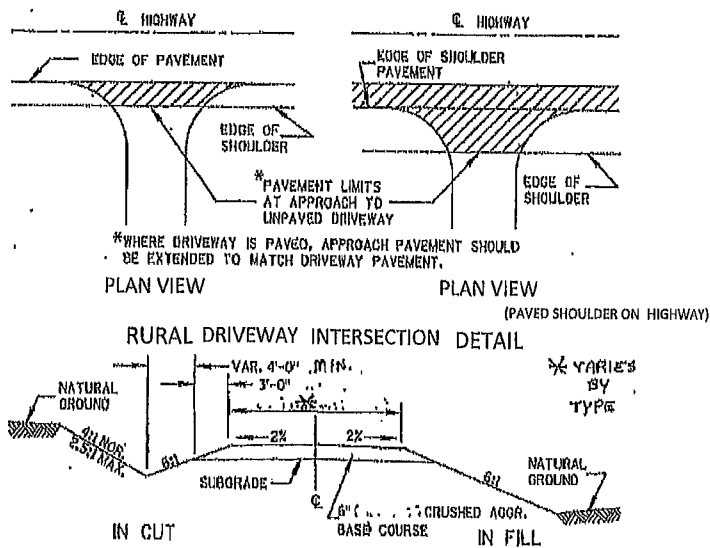
Access onto a CTH may require an apron paved with asphalt within the right-of-way of the CTH in instances when usage or drainage warrants as determined by the Commission. This paving shall be at the owner's expense.

3.7 Design Standards.

Driveways and roads within the CTH right-of-way must comply with the following design standards:

- (A) Culverts, when required, must be at least 30 feet long plus end walls, be placed to provide at least 1 foot of cover over the top of the pipe, be a minimum of 18 inches in diameter or equivalent or as large as needed for adequate drainage, be at least 10 feet from the nearest culvert, and be constructed of corrugated metal or dual wall high-density polyethylene HDPE, with metal end walls (plastic end walls shall not be allowed).
- (B) Access height at the point of the culvert, shall be equal to or lower than the level of the outside edge of the adjacent road shoulder.
- (C) Slopes to the side of the access shall not be steeper than 4 to 1 (25 percent) or that of the embankment of the existing CTH, whichever is less. Embankment sloping may be grass, gravel, asphalt, or stone at a maximum size of 8 inches in diameter. Sloping material may not hinder operation of maintenance vehicles.
- (D) Retaining walls, stone walls, etc. shall not be allowed on driveways within the right-of-way.
- (E) Any paving of an access in the right-of-way, whether new, resurface, or replacement shall only be asphalt and only allowed by permit and shall be placed/replaced at the owner's expense.
- (F) Crowning of the access shall be provided with a minimum pitch of 2 percent towards the side of the access.
- (G) Curb and gutter shall not be allowed within the CTH right-of-way for private access.
- (H) The angle formed between the centerline of a driveway (measured along that section of the driveway which is within the highway right-of-way) and the centerline of the CTH shall be as close to 90 degrees as possible, but not less than 75 degrees on either side.
- (I) Facing access on opposite sides of a CTH shall be located directly opposite each other whenever possible.
- (J) Shared access may be required to minimize the number of access points and interruption of traffic flow and provide a safe access point as determined by the Commission.
- (K) Private driveways which provide access to one or two residential parcels shall have a

- maximum 20' width and a 20' return radii. See section (S) Figure 1 below.
- (L) Field entrances shall have a maximum 40' width and 25' return radii. See section (S) Figure 1 below.
 - (M) Commercial driveways shall have a maximum 40' width and 25' return radii. See Section (S) Figure I below.
 - (N) A bypass lane shall be required where the ADT of the adjacent CTH and other factors warrant as determined by the Commission.
 - (O) Turnarounds should be provided so that vehicles do not need to back out onto a CTH and may be required if safety issues warrant installation. Installation shall be at owner's expense. Turnarounds, if constructed, shall be installed on private property.
 - (P) Existing CTH property including road surfaces, curbs, shoulders, slopes, ditches, and vegetation shall be restored to its original condition.
 - (Q) Vision corners must be free of all obstructions at each access point in accordance with the applicable vision corner diagram below. Driveway vision corners are to be measured from a point 3.5 feet above the center of the proposed access, 15 feet back from the edge of pavement of the CTH, to two points 2 feet above the center of the nearest on-coming lane of the CTH in each direction, at a distance of "D" from the point where the CTH meets the center of the proposed access. Distance "D" shall correspond to the speed limit of the road. If the given speed limit is not listed, the next highest speed limit shall be used. See Section (S) Figure 2 below.
 - (R) For any development which will, in the opinion of the Commission, have probable significant impacts on abutting County Trunk Highways due to increased traffic flow, increased turning movements or detrimental effect on existing traffic, the Commission may require a Traffic Impact Analysis (TIA) be completed and submitted to the Commission prior to considering granting an access permit. The TIA shall determine the type of improvements required to provide safe access to the development, including, but not limited to, increased turning radii, segregated turn lanes and bypass lanes. A professional traffic engineer licensed to do work in the State of Wisconsin shall certify the TIA. The costs of the TIA and any required improvements shall be borne by the applicant.

3.8 Access Control Map.

The location of all access points on CTH's should be established on a map named "THE OFFICIAL HIGHWAY ACCESS CONTROL MAP OF WOOD COUNTY", which will be drawn and updated by the COMMISSION. Copies of this map shall be available to the public at the Wood County Highway Department and Planning & Zoning Department.

Chapter 4 Administration and Enforcement

4.1 Administration.

The Commission is hereby authorized to administer this ordinance outside municipal boundaries within Wood County and within incorporated municipal boundaries for CTHs under the jurisdiction of the Commission. Within incorporated municipal boundaries, the Commission may not be the controlling authority on access to CTHs with a speed limit equal to or less than 35 m.p.h. and therefore must coordinate with the municipality.

Applications for permits shall be made to the Wood County Highway Commission. The Highway Commissioner or designee shall review the proposed development or construction and shall either grant or deny the proposed access permit based upon the provisions, standards, and requirements of this ordinance, within thirty (30) working days of receipt of a complete application.

4.2 Construction.

No structure, object, excavation, or item of landscaping shall be constructed, reconstructed, altered, placed, installed, or planted within the right-of-way of a CTH until an access permit has been issued by the Commission. Any utility relocation required for installation shall be the permittee's responsibility prior to installation.

Said permit shall be placed in clear view as near to the point of proposed construction or access as possible. If not constructed within one year from date of issuance, the access permit shall expire and a new permit shall be applied for. The Commission may extend approval of an access permit at its sole discretion.

4.3 Maintenance.

Wood County shall not be responsible for any routine maintenance of a private access/access culvert including the removal of snow, ice, or sleet from the access or from the culvert. The culvert shall be kept free of debris and sediment. Also, the culvert should be protected from the possibility of fire and rodent damage.

When culverts have failed and create potential for damage to the highway, the property owner will be given notice to replace the culvert. If the condition allows, the property owner will be given 30 days to replace the culvert. If the property owner does not resolve the issue in 30 days, the Commission will perform the necessary work and bill the property owner in accordance with the fee structure.

If the condition requires immediate action by the Commission to prevent damage to the highway, the Commission will take the necessary action to minimize harm and expense to both the highway and the property.

4.4 Fees.

Installation of the access by the Wood County Highway Department shall require all fees to be paid for by the applicant upon billing by the Commission based on the current fee schedule. Payment in full for all fees is required prior to installation. Payment for a required culvert pipe shall be through a Town order. Installation of the access by Private Contractor or Owner shall require the payment of the Access Permit fee and Prepaid Owner Deposit prior to issuance of the Access Permit. Requests for reimbursement of the Prepaid Owner Deposit shall occur within one year of date of issuance of the Access Permit, unless an extension of the Access Permit is requested and approved by the Commission. If no written request for reimbursement of the Prepaid Owner Deposit is received by the Commission within either one year of the date of issuance of the Access Permit, or within one year of the date of approval of an extension of the Access Permit, the Prepaid Owner Deposit shall be retained permanently by the Commission.

4.5 Appeals.

Any person aggrieved by any decision made in the administration of this ordinance may appeal to the Wood County Highway Committee.

Appeals shall be filed within thirty (30) calendar days following the administrative decision by the Commission. Appeals shall be filed in writing with the Committee. The appeal shall specify the legal description of the parcel and access location in question and the reason given for the appeal. If possibly materially affected by the granting of a variance, the adjacent property owner(s) shall be notified by mail of the date and time of the hearing and the appellant's name and the variance requested a minimum of seven (7) calendar days prior to the hearing.

Where the Committee finds that unnecessary hardship may result from strict compliance with these regulations, it may vary the regulations, provided that the public interest is secured and that such variation will not establish an undesirable precedent and will not have the effect of nullifying the intent and purpose of these regulations. Any modifications or variance thus granted shall be entered in the minutes of the Committee setting forth the reasons which, in the judgment of the Committee, justified the modification or variance.

The Committee shall make a decision on the appeal within forty-five (45) calendar days from the day the appeal was filed. The appeal fee shall be as stated in the fee schedule and shall be due and payable at the time of filing of the appeal.

4.6 Violations.

In the case of any violation of this ordinance, the Commission may institute appropriate legal action up to and including removal of any item contrary to this ordinance and revocation of the access permit. Each day in which a violation continues to exist shall constitute a separate offense.

4.7 Penalties.

Any person, firm, or corporation found guilty of violating any part(s) of this ordinance shall be subject to the fees and penalties as listed in the fee schedule and Section 86.07(2) of the Wisconsin State Statutes.

- 1 **AN ACT** *to amend* 346.01 (2); and *to create* 38.04 (4) (e) 8., 115.28 (11) (h), 343.71
2 (5) (h), 346.275 and 346.30 (6) of the statutes; **relating to:** liability of owners
3 of vehicles involved in certain speed limit and failure to yield right-of-way
4 violations, driver education instruction, and providing a penalty.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill authorizes the citation of owners of vehicles for certain highway work zone speed and failure to yield violations. The bill also requires driver education instruction related to highway work zone safety.

Current law imposes, with exceptions, liability on the owner of a vehicle that is observed violating certain traffic laws, including illegally passing a school bus or fire truck, illegally crossing a railroad crossing or controlled school crossing, and failing to yield the right-of-way to an emergency vehicle or a funeral procession.

This bill imposes liability on the owner of a vehicle involved in a violation related to the failure to yield the right-of-way to certain persons engaged in maintenance or construction work in a highway work zone. Under this bill, a flagman who observes a vehicle involved in this sort of a failure to yield violation may report the violation to a traffic officer so that a citation may be issued.

An owner is subject to the same forfeiture that would be applicable to the vehicle operator for the violation, but the owner's operating privilege may not be suspended or revoked, and no demerit points may be recorded against the owner's driving record. Among the defenses available to an owner, the owner is not liable if the owner identifies the operator of the vehicle at the time of the violation and the

operator admits to being the operator or if the owner has reported the vehicle as stolen. If an owner successfully asserts certain defenses, the person operating the vehicle at the time of the violation may be charged with the violation.

Under current law, the Department of Public Instruction must approve certain driver education courses offered by school districts and establish minimum standards for driver education courses offered by private driver schools, the Technical College System Board must approve courses of study for each program offered in technical college district schools, including driver education courses, and the Department of Transportation licenses private driver schools and DOT may not license a driver school unless its course of instruction includes the content required for TCSB approval of a driver education course.

Under this bill, all approved driver education courses must acquaint each student with the hazards posed by highway work zones and provide at least 30 minutes of instruction in safely dealing with these hazards.

Subject: County Land & Parks

Members of the Wood County Board of Supervisors,

Recently an email has been circulating among local municipalities requesting a show of support to change in county forest land and how revenue generated from the timber sales is dispersed. In lieu of taxes, the local municipality's receive 10 percent of the annual revenue generated from timber sales in the county. In most cases, the county forest land would generate far more revenue if it were included in the tax role. The 10 percent annual revenue typically does not cover the discrepancy in land value to local municipalities. In addition, in most cases, local municipalities are responsible for maintaining the roadways that allow access to this land for both harvesting and recreational use.

The argument may be made that the townships are benefiting from having county land and parks in their municipality for recreational use. In our circumstance, the township of Richfield has several county parks within the boundary of our municipality. The residents for the Township of Richfield are burdened with the responsibility of maintaining the roadways leading to these county parks. Looking specifically at the North Wood County Park, most people visiting and camping at the North Wood County Park do not reside in the Township of Richfield. The residents of the Township of Richfield are burdened with maintaining two of the three access points to the North Wood County Park. One of these entrances is open when the main gates to the park are open. The other is used as an emergency entrance and exit when there is high water preventing vehicles from utilizing the bridge into the campground area. In the past, the Township of Richfield was approached by the Wood County Highway Department to share repair costs to these access points when the repair work was clearly not on a Township of Richfield Roadway (specifically the south entrance to the North Wood County Park).

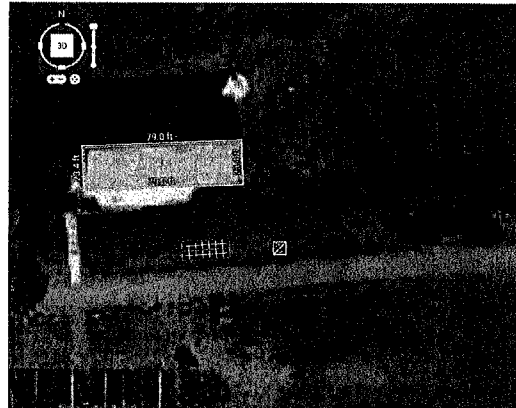

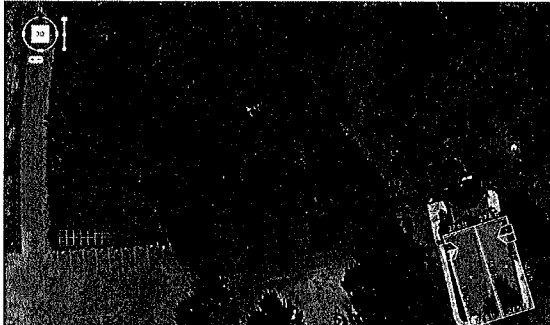

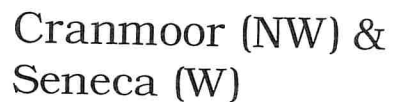

- Do Not Cut any White or Red Pine, standing Oak that is not damaged, or any red or blue marked trees.
- The standard utilization is 5" minimum top diameter for aspen, oak, and mixed hardwood pulpwood.
- All species and products must be cut concurrently when harvesting the timber.

ACCESS: There is good access to the sale areas either directly off town roads or down existing access roads. Existing access roads are shown on the attached timber sale map.

RESTRICTIONS:

- The county may restrict the type of equipment used on the job if conditions or damage warrant.
- Seasonal Restrictions: Logging chance is dependent on ground and weather conditions. Soils will require dry conditions for harvest.
